

Ordnance Survey - A Brief History

- Formed in 1791
- Produced paper maps of England, Scotland and Wales for 190 years
- All of the historical maps are held in The National Archives or at the Deposit Libraries
- In 1970's began digitising the large scale data.
- Activity completed in 1995.
- Within a few years we also had a digital contour dataset
- In 1999 we signed an agreement to become The National Archives first Electronic Place of Deposit.
- This covered Landline and Landform Profile for the entire country

- AddressBase
- Vector Map Local
- Vector Map District
- Terrain 5
- Terrain 50
