FIG was founded in 1878 in Paris. FIG is a federation of national associations and is the only international body that represents all surveying disciplines. Over 110 countries are represented in FIG.

FIG is a UN-recognised non-government organisation (NGO) and its aim is to ensure that the disciplines of surveying and all who practice them meet the needs of the markets and communities they serve.

FIG realises its aim by promoting the practice of the profession and encouraging the development of professional standards.

FIG recognises that markets for surveyors' services are constantly changing. Its plans emphasise strengthening professional institutions; promoting professional development; and encouraging surveyors to acquire new skills and techniques so that they may be properly equipped to meet the needs of society and the environment.

FIG Standards Network objectives include

- Building and maintaining relations with the secretariats of standardisation bodies;
- Proposing priorities on FIG's standardisation activities;
- Setting up necessary Liaison relationships with standardisation bodies;
- Ensuring that lead contacts to Technical Committees etc are in place;
- Maintaining an information flow on standardisation to FIG members, including through the FIG website and FIG Bulletin, and more directly to relevant Commission Officers;
- Maintaining the Guide on Standardisation and related material on the FIG website;
- Working with other NGOs, within the framework of the MOUs signed by the Council; and
- Advising FIG's officers and members on standardisation activities as necessary
